Four Stage Response System

Stage 1

Stage 1 triggers when absence rate surpasses 7-14% in Elementary or High School

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Stage 2

Stage 2 triggers when absence rate surpasses 15% of students in Elementary or High School

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Stage 3

Stage 3 triggers when the absence rate surpasses 25% of students in Elementary or High School

Attendance rate must remain below 15% for 10 school days before returning to Stage 2

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Stage 4

Stage 4 is triggered by government mandate or natural disasters and provides provisions for reopening

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As a private school, Trinity Christian Academy will follow the reopening guidance of our accrediting agencies and TCAL, which align closely with Texas Education Agency guidelines. Trinity has a four-stage response system.

At this time, we plan to reopen school at the Stage 1 level on August 17, as posted on our [2020-21 School Calendar](#). A letter explaining our reopening plan will be shared by the Director at our August 10th Meet the Teacher forum.

Every day, new COVID-19 information is being discovered as scientists and medical professionals are able to study and test this virus. Our plans to reopen are subject to change as circumstances warrant. This may mean that prior to August 17th, 2020, the reopening stage may change.
